

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

### YASASVI ENTRANCE TEST(YET) 2022

**IMPORTANT : All Candidates are requested to read COVID-19 related Guidelines/Advisory available on NTA website and on the Admit Card**

This document is merely an attempt to provide answers to some common questions posed to us, by the candidates. However, this list is neither exhaustive nor does it purport to be a source of complete information on the subject. Hence candidates are advised, in their own interest to refer to the Information Bulletin on the NTA website and ensure that they meet eligibility criteria. <b>Overview about the Exam</b>		
1	What is YASASVI ENTRANCE TEST(YET) for?	YASASVI ENTRANCE TEST(YET) is for selection of eligible candidates for award of scholarship to candidates studying in Class IX and Class XI in identified Schools under the YASASVI Scheme.
2	What is the type of the test?	The test is an Objective type test comprising Multiple Choice Questions. Each question will have 4 possible answer options. Candidate will be required to mark any one of the options that he/she considers as the correct or the most appropriate answer..
3	What is the mode of conducting the test?	The test will be conducted in CBT mode. The test comprises Multiple Choice questions.
4	Who are all eligible to apply?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applicants should be Indian Nationals</li><li>• They should be OBC(NCL) as per Central List or EBCs or DNTs.</li><li>• Candidate applying for Class 9 should be born between 01-04-2006 to 31-03-2010 (both days inclusive).</li><li>• Candidate applying for Class 11 should be born between 01-04-2004 to 31-03-2008 (both days inclusive).</li><li>• Income of the parents or guardian of the applicant should be not more than Rs. 2.5 lakhs per annum</li><li>• Should be studying in Class IX or Class XI in the Identified Schools</li><li>• Should have passed Class VIII or Class X during the academic year 2021-22</li></ul> Please go through the Information Bulletin hosted on the NTA website for more information in this regard

9	Will the exam for Class IX and Class XI be held in the same session as the same time?	Yes. Exam for both Class IX and Class XI will be held in the same session and same date. Candidates will have to ensure that they answer the question paper meant for them, as indicated on their Admit Card.

14	Is there any exam fee?	Candidates are not required to pay any exam fee.																														
15	What is the last date for submission of applications?	Candidates can apply online during the period from 27.07.2022 to 26.08.2022.																														
16	What are the documents that are to be uploaded while applying?	An applicant has to upload the following documents: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Passport size Photograph</li> <li>• Signature</li> <li>• Category Certificate</li> <li>• Income Certificate</li> <li>• PwD certificate if applicable</li> </ul>

18	What precautions should I take regarding eligibility?	It is the responsibility of the candidates to go through the Information Bulletin carefully and ensure that they are eligible to apply for the exam.
19	When is the form deemed to be complete?	<p>Application will be deemed to be complete only when the candidates had filled in all the required fields and also uploaded the required documents and also generated the Confirmation Page.</p> <p>If the candidate has not uploaded the required documents and has not generated the Confirmation Page, the application will not be considered as having been submitted and hence no Admit Card to such candidate will be issued.</p> <p>Candidate has to ensure that he generates and prints the Confirmation Page.</p>
20	Do I need to send Confirmation Page to NTA?	<p>The Candidates are NOT required to send/ submit the Confirmation Page of Online Application Form (or any document) to the NTA. However, they are advised to retain the following documents with them for any future reference/correspondence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Copy of the Confirmation Page of Online Application Form (Download, save and Print at least 3 copies)</li> <li>• Photographs (same as uploaded on the Online Application Form)</li> </ul>
21	If I have made any mistake(s) while registering/applying, can I make changes later in the Application Form?	<p>Once you have submitted the form, details provided in the form cannot be edited/changed.</p> <p>However, NTA shall open the “Correction Window” as per the schedule and Correction in particulars of Application Form can be incorporated on the website only during “Correction Window“.</p> <p>No corrections shall be allowed after the closure of correction window and all particulars entered by the candidate would be considered as final.</p>
22	I carried out corrections and submitted. After submission, I found that still there is some more correction to be done. Can I do so?	After submission of corrections, you cannot reopen the application and add more corrections. Please check the corrections before submission.
23	What should candidate do,	Use updated version of Mozilla Firefox/Internet Explorer

	when ‘continuous timeout’, ‘Server Error’ or ‘file not found error’ occurs while making correction in Application Form?	and good internet connection while filling application form. In case of continuous time out, one can clear cookies and history of the browser and fill during off-peak hours
24	I am not able to verify my email ID. What should I do?	It is possible that there could be an error in the Email ID provided in the application form. Correct it and try again.
25	I have forgotten my application number. How do I get it?	You check your mail box. Your application form has been communicated to you by way of a mail.
26	What is the role of NTA?	Role of NTA is confined to registration of candidates, issue of Admit Cards, conduct of exam, finalise answer keys after challenge, process and declare results, host Score Cards and finalise and display Merit List. NTA has no role to play in the award of scholarships.

27	How do I get my Admit Card?	The Admit Card will be uploaded on NTA website <a href="https://yet.nta.ac.in">https://yet.nta.ac.in</a> as per the schedule communicated through the website. Candidates need to check the Admit Card carefully for all particulars e.g Roll No. Name, Medium, Date of Birth, Gender, Examination Centre Name, City, Category, etc No physical Admit Cards will be sent by post.

29	Where can I get the name of exam centres?	The name of the test centre of each candidate is indicated on his/her respective Admit Card. Please check your Admit Card.
30	Can I change my exam city after receiving Admit Card?	No, you will not be allowed to change your exam city once Admit Card has been issued. While applying candidates have to select any four cities of their choice. The efforts will be made to allot city of examination to the candidates in order of the choice opted by them in their application form. Please select your preferred choices carefully. However, NTA reserves the right to change the city based on the feasibility. The Examination City Centre, once opted, shall not be changed.
31	Am I required to affix my	Admit Card contains a Declaration cum Undertaking

	photograph on the Admit Card?	regarding COVID 19. You are required to affix your photograph and left hand thumb impression at the foot of the Declaration/Undertaking and also get the signature of your parent affixed at the space provided, before reaching the centre. You will be required to sign on the Admit Card in the presence of the Invigilator at the exam centre.

32	What is the reporting time at the exam centre?	Please check your Admit Card that will be hosted on <a href="https://yet.nta.ac.in">https://yet.nta.ac.in</a>
33	What is the latest time for entry into the exam centre?	1.30 PM
34	Can I leave the test hall, if I complete the test before time?	No. You cannot leave the test hall until the test concludes and the invigilator allows you to go.
35	What are the items which are permitted inside the test hall?	You are permitted to carry the following items to the test centre: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Personal transparent water bottle</li> <li>• Personal hand sanitizer (50 ml)</li> <li>• A simple transparent Black/Blue Ball Point Pen</li> <li>• Admit Card along with Self Declaration (Undertaking) downloaded from the NTA website (a clear printout on A4 size paper) duly filled in and photo affixed.</li> <li>• Valid ID cards( School ID card with photo/Aadhar Card/Passport/Ration Card or any Photo ID Card issued by Govt. agency)</li> <li>• A photograph for affixing on the attendance sheet</li> </ul>
36	Will I be given fresh mask at the test centre?	Yes. You are required to wear the mask given at the test centre during the test.
37	Should I carry some blank sheets to the exam centre for doing rough work?	No. You will be given 5 sheets at the exam centre for doing rough work. On completion of the exam, candidates will have to drop these sheets in designated boxes as instructed by the invigilator.
38	Should I carry a calculator?	No. You are not allowed to carry calculators to the exam hall.
39	Do I have to surrender the Admit Card to the invigilator at the exam centre?	Yes. You are required to drop your Admit Card in the drop box while leaving the exam hall, after the conclusion of the exam.
40	Am I required to carry a photograph to affix on the attendance register?	Yes. You are required to affix your photograph on the attendance sheet, at the designated space.
41	What precaution should I	The name on the photo identification must match with the

	take while carrying documents?	<p>name as shown on the Admit Card.</p> <p>If the name has been changed, candidate must show the relevant document like Legal Name Change Document at the time of examination.</p>
	How do I answer questions in the Computer Based Test?	Detailed guidelines on the Procedure for appearing in computer based tests are given in the Information Bulletin. You may go through them.
42	Can I take the exam from any computer?	No, a candidate will have to appear for the exam on a pre-assigned workstation of the test center allocated to him/her.
43	Can I move back and forth between the questions?	<p>Yes, candidates will have the option to navigate between the questions by following instructions available on the User Interface.</p> <p>They may change even answer options, anytime before they enter submit button.</p>
44	What precautions do I need to take during the examination?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Please ensure that Exam( Say for Class IX or for Class XI) indicated on the screen is the same as per your Admit Card. In case of any discrepancy please inform Invigilator immediately.</li> <li>• It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that he/she attempts the paper meant for him/her( i.e. Class IX or Class XI as the case may be) as indicated on the Admit Card.</li> <li>• Attempting different paper would lead to rejection of the candidature.</li> </ul>
45	What if I could not appear in the examination on scheduled date?	<p>No candidate will be allowed to appear at the examination centre/date/timings other than that allotted to them in their Admit Card.</p> <p>Important: For those who are unable to appear on the scheduled date of test for any reason, retest shall not be held by the NTA under any circumstances.</p>
46	What will I be provided with during the exam?	<p>At the test centre, each candidate will be allotted a desk with a computer terminal and white sheets for rough work.</p> <p>Rough work cannot be done on any other paper/sheet, as no other material will be allowed inside the examination room. On completion of the exam, candidates will have to drop these sheets in designated boxes as instructed by the invigilator.</p>

		Every candidate would also be offered a mask. They would be provided material for hand sanitization too.
47	How do I know when the exam time has ended?	There will be an on-screen timer on the top right corner of your screen which will count down for the allocated time. Candidates are advised to check this timer regularly and allocate their time carefully.
48	Will I be able to leave early if I finish the exam before the allocated exam time has ended?	No, candidates will not be allowed to leave until the entire duration of the exam is over with the exception of genuine medical emergency.
49	In case of any technical problems with the computer system, at the exam centre, what should I do? Will I lose time or the answers I had marked earlier ?	NO. In case of any technical problems with the computer at the exam centre and you are not able to continue the exam, inform invigilator. He/She would fix the issue or will map you to another PC through a proper process. Your exam time in the next session will commence from the time you discontinued your exam, There would be no loss of time for you. Answers input by you will also get saved automatically. There would be no loss of answers input by you.

50	Will there be negative marking for wrong answers?	No. There would be no negative marking for a wrong answer.
51	Will I get an opportunity to view my responses, the questions and the answers? Will I get an opportunity to challenge the answers, in case I feel that the answer to any question is incorrect, in my opinion?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- After exam, NTA will display the Questions, recorded responses and Provisional Answer Keys on the NTA website, on a date communicated to candidates through NTA website and public notice in advance.</li> <li>- Candidates, who are not satisfied with the answer key, may challenge by filling online application form and paying a non-refundable fee of Rs.200/-per question, through the given window. Applications received by hand or by fax or email will not be considered.</li> <li>- Experts will check the challenges received, and if needed key is revised.</li> <li>- The result will be compiled on the basis of final verified answer keys.</li> <li>- No grievance with regard to answer key(s) after declaration of result will be entertained. The NTA's decision on the challenges shall be final and no further communication will be entertained.</li> </ul>

52	How will I come to know the final answer keys based on which the results are ultimately processed	Final answer keys based on which the results are processed, will be hosted on the NTA website before results.
53	What is the evaluation methodology?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If all options are found to be correct – Full marks will be awarded to all students, who have attempted the question.</li> <li>• If more than one option is correct, marks will be awarded to all those candidates who have marked any one of the correct options</li> <li>• If a question for any reason is found to be wrong or none of the options in the questions is correct, or there are other technical issues, the benefit of marks will be given to all the candidates who appeared in the exam.</li> </ul>
54	When will results be declared?	Results will be processed and the score card will be hosted on NTA website. Be in touch with the NTA website for updates.
55	What is the qualifying criteria?	There is no such thing as qualifying or passing criteria in the exam. Marks obtained by the candidates will be indicated on the Score Card.
56	Can I apply for re-checking my answers, after results?	No.
57	Will there be a Merit List also?	NTA will prepare a State wise Merit List and host on its website <a href="https://yet.nta.ac.in">https://yet.nta.ac.in</a>
58	How will rank be determined in case more than one candidate secure the same marks?	In case the total marks scored by more than one candidate in YET 2022 are equal, the inter-se merit shall be determined as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Older in age</li> <li>• Application number in ascending order</li> </ul>
<b>MISCELLANEOUS</b>		
59	I am a PwD candidate, eligible for a scribe. What relaxations am I entitled to?	PwD candidates with benchmark disabilities are eligible for compensatory time( Extra time) at the rate of 20 minutes for each hour of exam. In other words, in this exam, PwD candidates with benchmark disabilities will be eligible for 1 hour extra time. They are also eligible for a scribe if they have a limitation to write the exam and upload a certificate to that effect from the prescribed Medical Authority. Candidates are required to indicate their status and whether they need a scribe or not in their application form while applying.

		<b>NTA will provide a scribe. Candidates are not allowed to bring their own scribe.</b>
